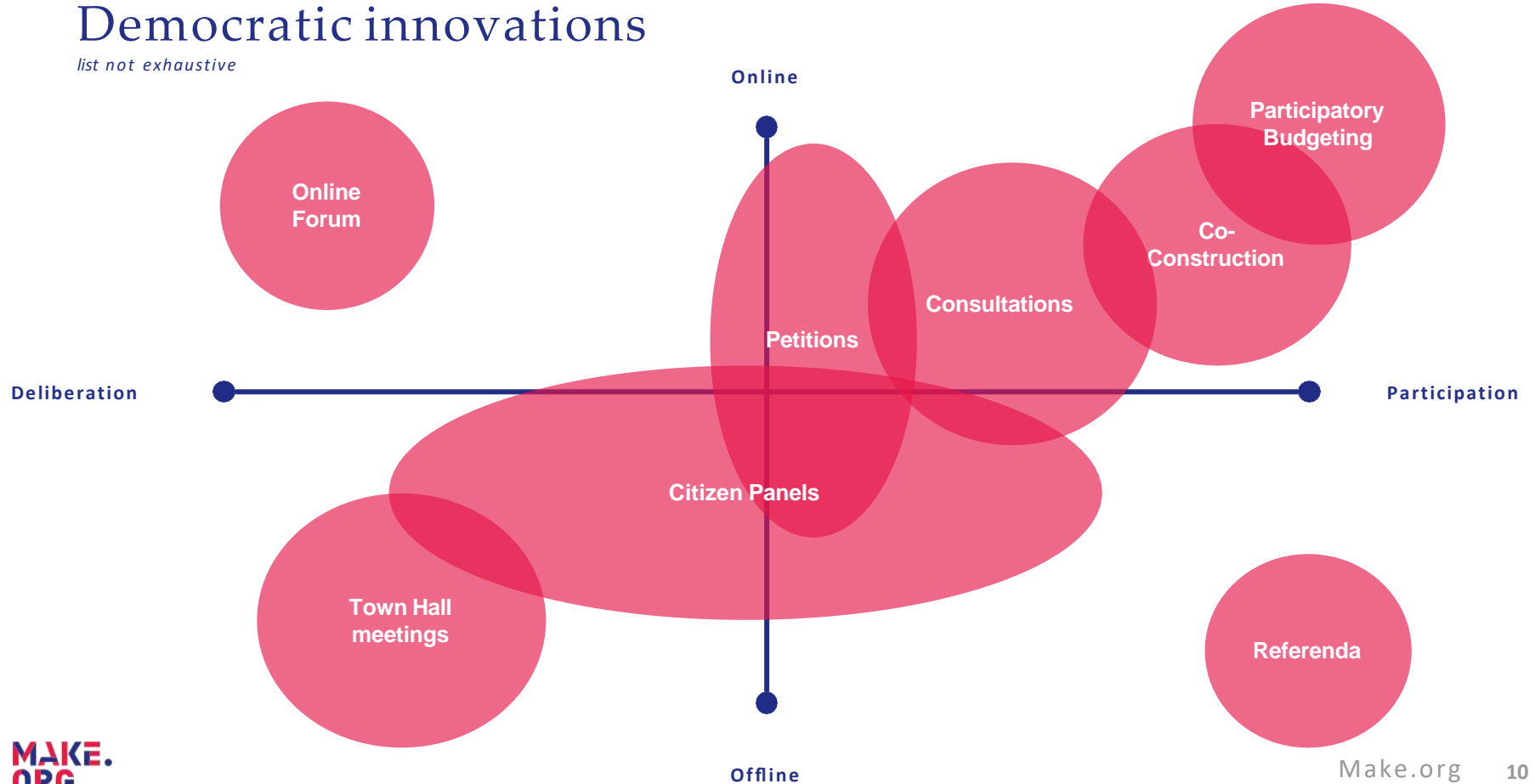

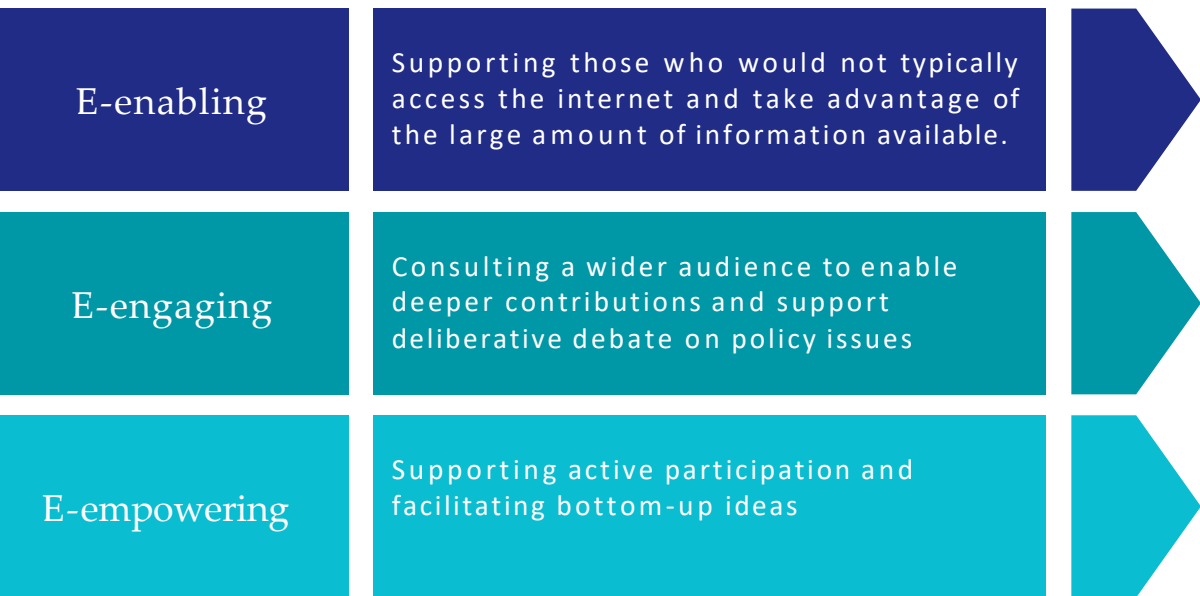

Grand Débat

France

“At the initiative of the President of the Republic, the Government launched a Great National Debate to allow everyone to discuss issues that are essential to the French people.”

Ireland’s Convention on the Constitution

Ireland

“The Convention on the Constitution was established by resolution of both Houses of the Oireachtas in 2012 to consider a number of possible changes to the Constitution and make recommendations.”

Conference on the Future of Europe

European Union

“The Conference on the Future of Europe is a unique and timely opportunity for European citizens to debate on Europe’s challenges and priorities.”

Bürgerrat Klima

Germany

“The Citizens’ Climate Council brought together 160 randomly selected citizens to discuss how compliance with Germany’s climate protection goals.”

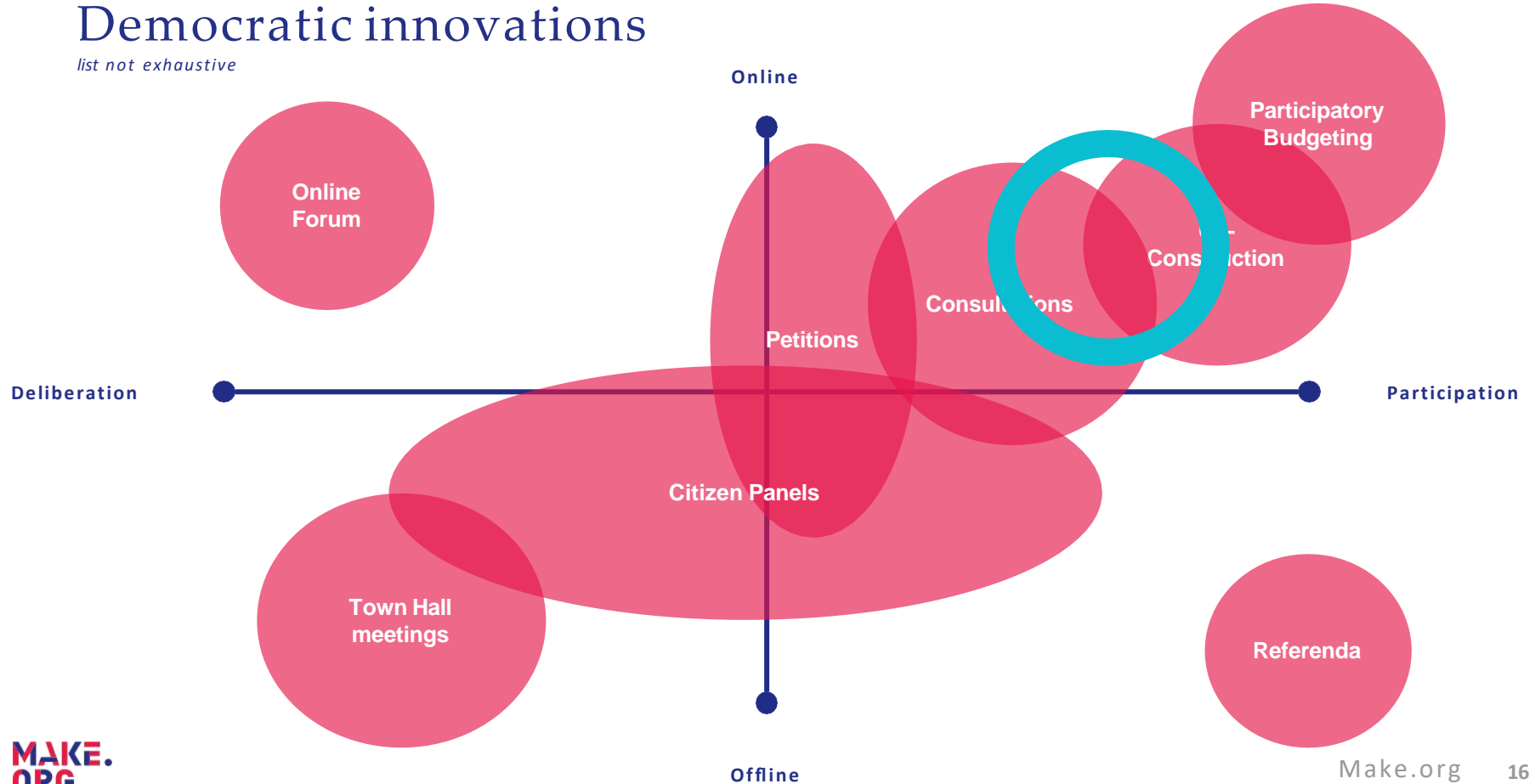

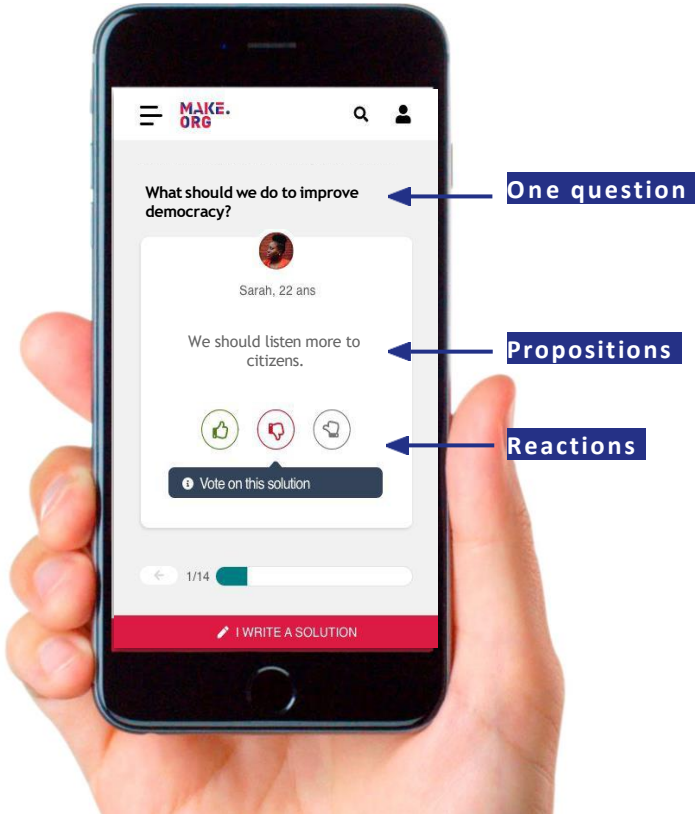

Communication and citizen mobilization

360° communications via three main channels



Digital campaigns

Mass recruitment on a representative basis: paid acquisition on social networks



Sharing by e-mail and on social networks



Internal or external mailings and sharing on the initiator's and partners' social networks

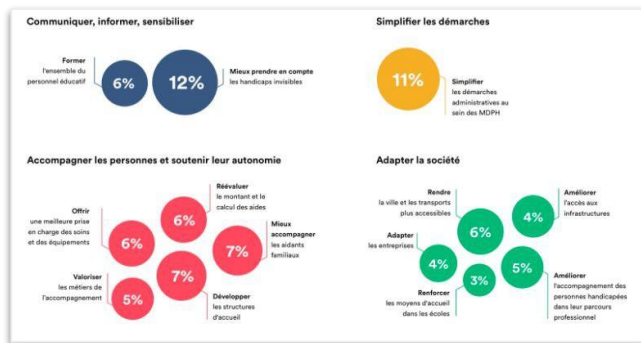


Media partnerships

- Wide media coverage of the consultation
 - “Widget” partnership
- A widget is a proprietary tool for inserting the consultation into digital media articles

Analyzing and sharing results

At the end of the consultation, our study team, composed of sociologists and data scientists, analyzes the results and creates a report. We then provide support in sharing the results with citizens and ensuring that an impact is made.



Analysis: involvement mapping:

- **Analysis of the most supported or controversial proposals** to create a mapping of top consensuses, controversies and rejections based on citizens' proposals and votes, **using NLP technologies and sociologists' expertise to group the proposals into clusters.**
- **Detailed final report** including the major lessons learned, a global view on proposal topics and the mapping of consensuses and controversies
