

Context






It dedicated its focus to deliberating ten pivotal policy choices aimed at forging a Renewed Social Contract for Europe. These choices emerge from extensive multisectoral and multi-stakeholder consultations, encapsulating the voices and insights of over 2,000 European citizens.

In 2023, the European Young Leaders (EYL40) programme, hosted two influential seminars in Brussels and Dublin, bringing together under-40 leaders from various sectors to address pressing challenges facing Europe. In Brussels, amid global events like International Women's Day and escalating tensions in Ukraine, participants engaged in debates on topics ranging from European Commission mandates and digital transitions to healthcare reforms and the energy crisis. In Dublin, former Irish Prime Minister John Bruton emphasised the necessity of European cohesion and patriotism to overcome demographic shifts, technological stagnation and geopolitical uncertainties.


